



First Swing Program Report: July 2014

During the school holidays the Level 4 & 5 golfers took part in the Boland Golf Union and Western Province Golf Union Junior Foundation tournaments.

FSP Level 4 golfer, Raylan De Wee participated in his first WPGU Junior Open in Parow on 7th July and scored 32 points in the C-division. Raylen picked up some valuable tournament experience during his round.

FSP Level 4 golfer, Ignation Douries had a good round of golf at the BGU Open at Langebaan on 8 July, coming in with a gross 89\75 nett (Handicap 14). At the BGU Open at Stellenbosch GC on the 10 July, Ignation had a cold start and brought in a gross 95\81 nett.

At the final BGU event at Arabella on 14-15 July, Ignation won both stroke play and match play rounds in the C-division with scores of 88 (1st round) and 88 (2nd round) thereafter his first matchplay he won 5\4 to qualify for the final, winning 2 up.

Charl Theron (Level 5 golfer) had a good couple of weeks on the fairways with some excellent scores.

 30^{th} June at the WPGU Erinvale Junior Open Charl finished 11^{th} with a gross score of 83. Next was a 2^{nd} place at the WPGU King David Open shooting a great 73 (winning score was 71).

3rd July - Mowbray Prentice Cup with a score of 80 finishing 7th

4th July – Stellenbosch Glacier Junior Series with a score of 76 finishing Tied 4th .

8th July – WPGU Milnerton Junior Open with a score of 72 finishing 4th

To end the holidays, at the Pearl Valley Swing Fit Winter Tournament, Charl finished 1^{st} with a gross score of 71. Charl is now playing from a 4 handicap.

Port Elizabeth coaching has resumed after the July holidays and we are happy to say that the extra equipment has been delivered to the region. Graham Whale Golf, who are running the FSP in Port Elizabeth said that these sessions are often the highlight of their week as the children are extremely enthusiastic and are enjoying their sessions.

Lonwabo and Reuben Birin have increased in numbers dramatically and we will be looking at increasing the sessions at these schools. The Chesire Homes sessions are increasing in popularity as well. We are investigating upgrading the facilities at Lonwabo / Reuben Birin, where we have a dedicated hall for our program.

Carlo Koks sessions continue with Carpe Diem regularly as well as playing 9 holes regularly with the Level 4 Juniors. 2 of these Juniors have been identified as potentially being registered at a golf club in 2015.

Unfortunately the teaching session with the physiotherapists was postponed. But we did get to see a new deaf school in Inchanga (about 40km outside KZN) where we met with the Sports co-ordinator and the Cato Ridge Golf Course. Proposed golf open day will take place on the 18th September where we will introduce all the Juniors from the school to golf and thereafter we will train the Juniors weekly.
